"Legalizing Mexican migration would, in one stroke, bring a huge underground market

into the open. It would allow American producers in important sectors of our economy to hire the workers they need to grow. It would raise wages and working conditions for millions of low skilled workers and spur investment in human capital. It would free resources and personnel for the war on terrorism. And the united states could use as many men and recourses as it has available. Contrary to common objections, evidence does not suggest that a properly designed system of legal Mexican migration will unleash a flood of new immigrants to the United States, hurt low-skilled Americans, burden taxpayers, create an unassimilated underclass, encourage lawbreaking, or compromise border security.” This quote was said by Daniel Griswold. The fact that this many illegal immigrants are sneaking into the border every year show that are borders are dangerously open to anyone who wanted to come across the border undetected. The reason illegal immigrants typically cross the border into America is for a better life and job. However by illegal immigrants crossing the border into America is weakening the legal and national security environment. When three out of every one hundred people in America are undocumented or have documented paper that are forged or faked are a threat to national security. That is pretty scary if a person gets thinking too much about it. Illegal immigrants don't pose a direct threat to national security. But if thousands of illegal immigrants are crossing the border every day that distorts the law, distracts resources, and effectively creates a cover for terrorists and criminals. In other words that the real problem that illegal immigration cause is security.

Federal investigators believe that as much as two point two million kilograms of cocaine and eleven point six kilograms of marijuana were smuggled into the United States over

the Mexican border in 2005. Thousands of people die every year because of the insane war on drugs. This is a quote from U.S. customs agent "In my career, spanning three decades, many of my friends and partners were killed on duty, enforcing immigration laws, and are listed on our honor rolls. Their deaths, and devotion to duty, are beyond politicians' ability to understand, it seems, and are without meaning. It seems as if basically all of the politicians are oblivious to the outside world these days. This past year the Patrol has arrested a million illegals, with twelve to fourteen million in country, home free. Mexican military incursions, escorting narcotics, are commonplace. Rival alien smuggling organizations thrive in Arizona, and politicians pander, and grovel to Mexico's demands, in a time of war." With the decline in the drug cartels in Columbia the Mexican cartels rise. The Sinaloa cartel and the Gulf cartel are battling over a billion dollar drug trade between Mexico and the United States. These cartels have strong tie with a lot of the United States gangs which is a really big problem. The United States Drug Enforcement Administration reports that the Mexican drug operation today along our Nation's Southwest border is far more dangerous and organized than any other organized crime group in the Americans law enforcement history. A 2006 study by the House Committee on Homeland Security that the Mexican cartels have almost complete control of the border from the U.S. and Mexican governments. This allows drugs from the cartel gangs to infiltrate through the borders into the United States.

On April 15 2013 the tragic horrifying terrorist attack, The Boston bombing at the Boston marathon was planed and organized by two legal aliens. This attack killed two people and injured two hundred and sixty four. The two illegal immigrants where brothers named

Dzhokhar and Tamerlan. This quote by the father of the brothers who committed the terrorist attack at the Boston marathon "I feel terrible! Why they kill my son? Something wrong! My sons never do bombing," he insisted. "They hated guns – how they do bombs?"
